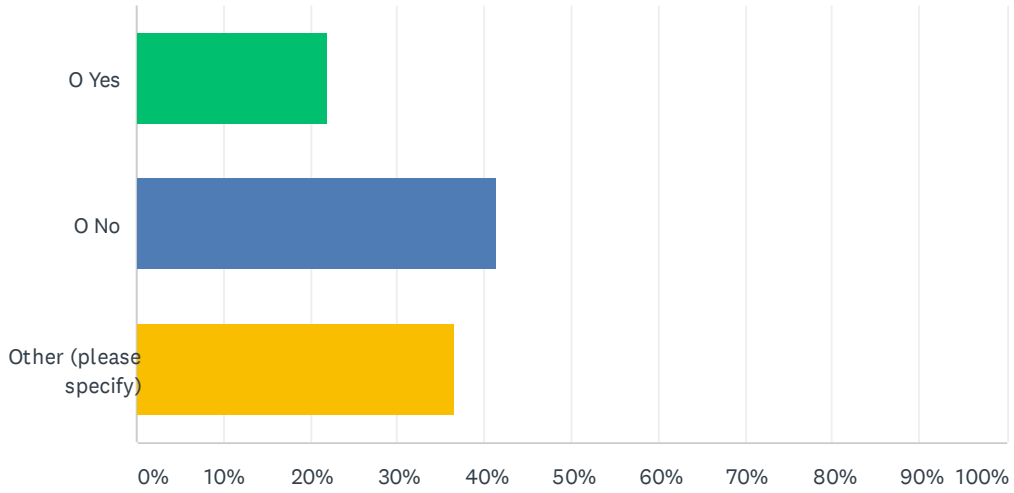




Q1 Do you plan to "mandate" students take the vaccine or will you "recommend, strongly encourage" that they do so?

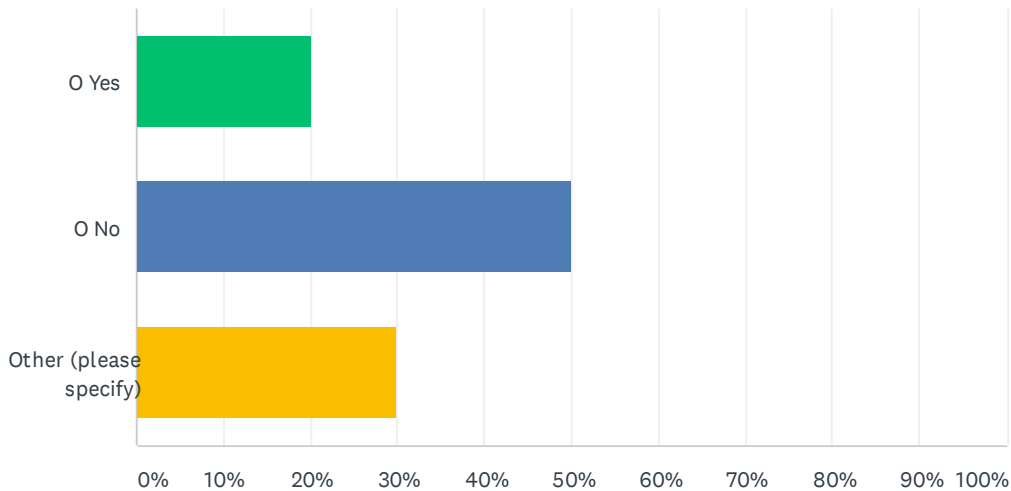

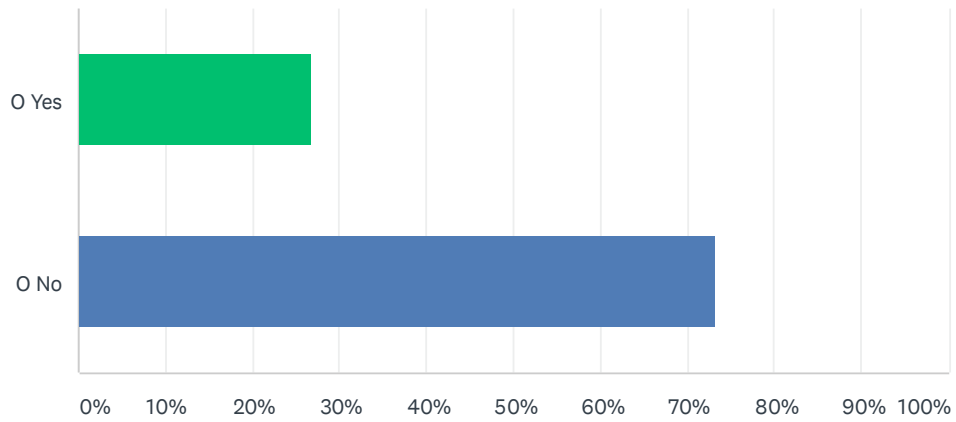

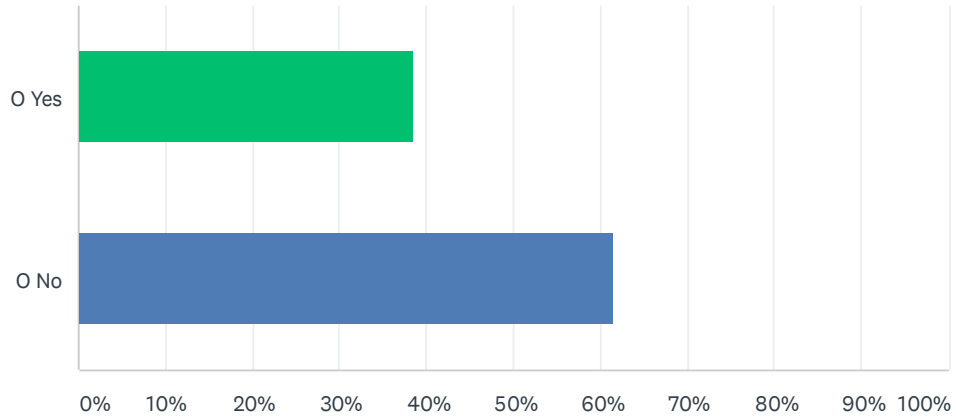

7	For those who question why it is taking so long to get these vaccines into arms, I offer a snippet of the logistics of administering these vaccines. First, those Minus 80 freezer cannot be purchased at Costco. Fortunately my institution has several for research and we have loaned them to our area hospitals. Of course you also need to have specialized equipment and procedures to remove vaccines stored at such low temperatures. Then when you are ready to actually administer the vaccines, you must have the space to socially distance each person and each injection/administration station, that further reduces the number of persons who can receive a vaccine at any one time. There is a least a 25 page "instruction manual" from the manufacturer that must be followed. There is a list of personnel who are authorized to actually administer the vaccines, most are the same nurses who are already stretched beyond human capability. After the injection, you have to have additional socially distancing space to monitor all who receive the vaccine for at least 20 minutes, and, it has to be medical personnel with EpiPens at the ready. Then you must enter the information into your states' department of health database per their requirements. And then, for most of the first vaccines distributed, you get to do it all over again in 3 weeks. We can and will do better, but it is not like the flu vaccine where you line up with 50 or so of your colleagues and get your shot and a sticker for your name badge and go back to work. This is such a critical juncture in this pandemic and so important and we will get there, despite the complete lack of direction or assistance from our Federal Government, but the general public needs to understand this is not the same process as the flu shot. On a positive note, we have several hundred front line caregivers, mostly medical residents and physicians and nurses, who received their vaccination at one or two of those hospitals we work with and who will be receiving their 2nd dose this week, which is cause for celebration.	1/5/2021 7:25 AM
