- + **Financial Strain:** Injuries may lead to time off work and mounting medical bills. Even with workers' compensation, upfront costs can be significant. The average claim for a slip and fall is approximately \$28,000—a financial burden for many.
- + **Emotional Toll:** Recovery can be stressful. The inability to work, physical pain, and financial pressure often lead to anxiety and depression.

Wearing slip-resistant footwear is a simple, effective way to reduce these risks and stay focused, safe, and productive at work.

Benefits of Slip-Resistant Footwear

- + Essential for jobs that require standing or walking for long periods
- + Oil-resistant soles help prevent slips in greasy environments
- + Replace shoes when tread wears down

- + Keep shoes clean—carry them to work to avoid parking lot debris
- + Maintain clean floors—pick up food spills promptly and use clean mops
- + Use separate mops for front and back-ofhouse areas to avoid cross-contamination

Choosing the Right Shoe

Selecting appropriate footwear starts with a Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) assessment.

Consider:

- + Closed toe and heel
- + Slip-resistant soles

- + Steel toe (if needed)
- + Comfort and support

Note: Standard tennis shoes are not slip-resistant unless specifically designed to be.

Department-Specific Considerations

- + Administration: May require closed-toe, low-heel shoes with good traction.
- + **Staff:** Should wear supportive, slip-resistant shoes with closed toe and heel to navigate varied hazards.
- + **Dining Services:** Require restaurant-grade shoes that protect against hot liquids and surfaces, with slip-resistant soles and enclosed design.
